



Several talented Mirfield organisations have come together and are creating a social and cultural hub centred in, and round the historic site of The Mirfield Maltings.



There's a reason behind the choice of name **The Mirfield Maltings** – Mirfield was famous for its large malting industry, producing malted grain for the breweries. Eastthorpe Lodge, which now houses the Mirfield library, was the home of the Crowther family who owned one of the major maltings in the 1800's. Using this unique area's history from yesteryear, we are developing what will be an exciting social and cultural project for the benefit of the residents of Mirfield now, and in the future.

Think of the Mirfield Maltings project as a recipe producing advantages and possibilities – concerts, cinema, art exhibitions, music, opera, drama, dances, festivals, indoor sport. Then Include into this mix, Mirfield's Bronte connections, the easy access to the local countryside and to the canal and river. Then add the many local people and civic groups who work tirelessly for the community, and suddenly, Mirfield becomes a town with special advantages. The various venues which make up the Mirfield Maltings project are assets for the residents, for visitors and for Mirfield.
